According to 2021/2022 statistics from the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA), there are currently 679,970 international students pursuing their degrees in the UK.

Compared to the **previous year (2020/2021),** the number of international students in the UK has experienced significant growth. Specifically, an **increase of 12.3%.**

03

Most **Non-EU students** in the UK come from **China**, a total of **151,690 students**.

04

India is the second non-EU country with the most students studying abroad in the UK currently, with a total of 126,535 students.

- High tuition fees, living costs, and currency exchange rates can strain budgets.
- Many international students need to find part-time job to support themselves.





Financial Issues Faced by International Students:

- Tuition Fees: Tuition fees for international students can be considerably higher than those for local students.
- Living Costs: The cost of living, including accommodation, food, transportation, and other daily expenses, can be substantial.
- Currency Exchange: Fluctuations in currency exchange rates can impact the value of funds from home countries.
- Limited Work Hours: Visa restrictions may limit the number of hours international students can work parttime.



Managing Finances Effectively:

To overcome financial challenges and manage funds effectively, international students can consider the following tips:

- ✓ Tuition Create a Budget: Develop a monthly budget that outlines your income, expenses, and savings goals. Stick to the budget to avoid overspending.
- Seek Scholarships and Financial Aid: Explore scholarship opportunities and financial aid programs available to international students. These can help offset tuition costs.
- Part-Time Employment: Find part-time work within the limits of your student visa. It can provide additional income for living expenses.
- ✓ Open a Local Bank Account: Having a local bank account can save you money on currency conversion fees and make financial transactions more convenient.
- ✓ Cook at Home: Preparing your meals at home is often more cost-effective than dining out.
- Use Student Discounts: Take advantage of student discounts on transportation, entertainment, superstores and other expenses.
- Explore Accommodation Options: Look for affordable housing options, shared accommodations, to reduce living costs.
- ✓ **Track Expenses**: Keep a record of all your expenses to identify areas where you can cut costs.
- Emergency Fund: Set aside a small portion of your income as an emergency fund for unexpected expenses.
